

HORSHAM TOWNSHIP RECEIVES STATEWIDE OUTSTANDING CITIZEN COMMUNICATION AWARD

Horsham Township has won four awards and the top honor – the 24th Annual Outstanding Citizen Communication Award – in the Pennsylvania State Association of Township Supervisors' 47th Annual Citizen Communication Contest. The annual contest recognizes townships that have successfully communicated programs and activities to their residents.

Horsham Township won the following categorical awards:

- First place in the Websites category;
- Second place in the Most Improved Newsletter category;
- Third place in the Annual Reports category; and
- Third place in the Other Publications category for our new resident handbook.



The contest attracted entries from across the Commonwealth in eight categories, including printed and electronic newsletters, most improved newsletters, annual reports, other publications, cable TV programming, social media, and websites. Horsham Township was the only entrant to win in more than two categories.

"We are really proud of this award and it is due to the hard work of our staff. We try to put out as much information as we can to the residents and in as many forms as we can" stated Township Manager William Walker.

HORSHAM NAMED NO. 7 ON LIST "TOP CITIES ON THE RISE" IN PA

Horsham has once again made a list highlighting its virtues, landing in a top-10 listing of Pennsylvania "cities on the rise," according to NerdWallet.com. The personal finance website places Horsham in the No. 7 spot based on scores calculated by such factors as population, employment and income growth from 2009 to 2012.

According to NerdWallet's findings, Horsham made the list in part thanks to its strong working-age population increase of 12.8% between 2009 and 2012. The township also experienced an 8.4% growth in median income during that same period, indicating that Horsham is poised for further growth and economic progress for years to come.

OFFICE PARK REVITALIZATION PLANNING



Horsham Township has turned to the Montgomery County Planning Commission for help in developing a master plan addressing future land uses and infrastructure improvements that will keep the Horsham Business Center and the Pennsylvania Business Campus competitive for the future.

Although the office buildings have a relatively low vacancy rate of about 11 percent, many of the office buildings were built in the late 1970s and 1980s and need to be updated. The master plan is expected to provide a shared vision for the future by identifying market opportunities, appropriate land uses, locations for new land uses, design guidelines, zoning changes, possible business park amenities and possible road and other infrastructure improvements. The master plan will take about a year to complete, with a presentation to Horsham Council expected to take place in December 2015.

REAL ESTATE TAX BILLS

Real Estate Tax bills for Horsham Township and Montgomery County will be mailed by March 1, 2015. The tax bill provides a portion of the necessary income for the Township to run effectively. Payment periods are as follows:



2% Discount
Pay tax bill by April 30, 2015


Face (full amount)
May 1, 2015 – June 30, 2015

10% Penalty
July 1, 2015 – December 31, 2015

Postmarks within the stated deadlines are accepted; and deadlines that fall on a Saturday, Sunday, or holiday, are due on the next business day. The deadline for the payment of real estate taxes to Horsham Township is by 12:00 noon on December 31st, and failure to pay by that deadline results in a lien being placed on the property and collection through the Montgomery County Tax Claim Bureau.

Fire Marshal Safety Tip

Fire Hydrants: For your safety, please help the Horsham Fire Company by clearing snow away from fire hydrants in front of your property. Firefighters need approximately three feet in all directions to be free of ice and snow in order to properly connect hoses to a fire hydrant. The few extra minutes



you spend clearing snow from your property and from a hydrant can make a big difference during an emergency.

Stormwater Winter Tips

Stormwater poses environmental concerns that require the combined efforts of citizens, government, and businesses. Here are a few things you can do to help counteract these problems:

- **Cars** – Take your car to the car wash where polluted water drains to the sanitary sewer for treatment. Collect and recycle vehicle fluids such as motor oil and anti-freeze.
- **Pets** – Pick up after your pet in your yard and when walking your dog.
- **Inlets** – Please make sure that inlets are open so that stormwater can enter them.

Code Enforcement

Is Your Building Number Posted Properly? All occupied buildings/residences are required to be identified by the street address assigned by the Township, posted in a matter that makes it clearly readable from the street.

- Compliance provides emergency responders with the ability to quickly locate a building/residence when urgent assistance is needed. Posting an easy-to-locate and easy-to-read address also provides a convenience for visitors and delivery personnel.
- Numbers should be minimum 4" in height, 1/2" in width and be of a contrasting color.



The following are a few things that you can do to help ensure a safe and happy winter for yourself and the Horsham Township Highway Department:

- * Horsham Township Highway Department oversees the clearing of 91.21 miles of roads in the township. Please try to be patient as we clear the roads.
- * Once snow accumulates two (2) inches or more and until the roadway is cleared by the Highway Department, no vehicle, trailer, boat or camper may be parked in the roadway.
- * Keeping sidewalks safe is an important winter concern. Residents must clear snow, sleet, and ice from sidewalks in front of their property no more than 24 hours after a storm. For stubborn icy spots, be sure to use ice control methods such as salt.
- * It is impossible for snowplows to avoid having snow placed at the bottom of driveways. A helpful hint is to shovel snow in driveways to the right side of the driveway (as you face the road) and clear the

area immediately to the left of your driveway.

* PennDOT clears the following 23.72 miles of state roads:

- County Line Road
- Easton Road (Route 611)
- Route 309

- * Remember that it is illegal to shovel, blow or plow the snow from your driveway and/or sidewalk into the street.
- * If you own a portable basketball hoop that you leave in the street, now is the time to remove it as they create a hazard for the snow removal crews.
- * Keep the storm water inlet open near your property. Keeping it open will prevent flooding and icing conditions on the street.

The Highway Department works extremely hard to make traveling on Township roads safe for everyone. Please be patient and allow time for them to arrive in your area and effectively remove snow and ice from the streets.



SPRING YARD WASTE COLLECTION



Yard waste is accepted daily at a dumpster behind the Community Center at 1025 Horsham Road. Residents may drop off leaves, shrubs, and tree limbs (not to exceed 4 feet long/4 inches thick). We cannot accept business waste, plastic bags or treated lumber.

All yard debris must be in bio-degradable paper yard waste recycle bags which can be purchased at grocery stores or at the Township Municipal Building (3 bags for \$1.00).

Each of the residential trash hauler's will also offer a Spring Yard Waste curbside pickup. Please watch the Horsham Township TV channel 22 and check the website for your trash hauler spring pickup date.



Horsham Rotary Club Funds Installation of Park Sunshades at Everybody's Playground In Luken's Park

Sun shades have been recently installed at Everybody's Playground by Horsham Township and funded by the Horsham Rotary Club. The total project cost is about \$52,000 with \$35,000 from the Horsham Rotary Club.

Mark McCouch, Council President, said the shades allow a cooler space for parents to watch their children while they play on the playground equipment. "It's part of an ongoing process with the Horsham Rotary Club to improve the park," McCouch said. The installation of the shades started in September, but it's a partnership that goes back more than a decade.

Since 2003, the Rotary Club put on a campaign to raise the funds needed to build a playground like no other in our area and they succeeded in a grand fashion. Everybody's Playground offers a sprawling handicap accessible playground for special kids with differences, making it universally accessible to children of all abilities to play together and enjoy each other safely. Since its initial installation a pavilion and handicap accessible basketball courts have been added, and the Rotary added a mister, see-saws more swings and now the addition of the new shades.

Rotary Club President Bart Allgeier said Rotarians are very proud of the project, but the work is not finished yet. Ideas are already being set in motion for the club's next addition to the park.

Stop by Lukens Park at 540 Dresher Road to see the new additions to Everybody's Playground. If you know a Rotarian, thank them for the positive contributions which they give and have given to the community you live in.

Horsham Township Council Approves 2015 Budget with NO Tax Increase

For 2015, Horsham Township will operate without raising taxes for the 13th year in a row, despite spending going up by 5.2 percent. Horsham Township Council unanimously adopted the 2015 budget at its December 10 meeting. 2015's \$16 million spending plan will maintain the real estate tax rate at 1 mill, the lowest tax rate in Eastern Montgomery County. The average single family home assessed at \$178,371 would pay a tax of \$178.37. Of the 1 mill tax, 0.47 (\$83.83) goes for the Horsham Township Library; 0.31 (\$55.30) goes for the fire company; and 0.22 (\$39.24) goes for the parks department. The township also charges a Local Services Tax of \$52 and an Earned Income Tax of 1 percent.

Some of the capital projects will include the following: a new 16 foot mower, connecting trail from Witmer Road to the Powerline Trail with flashing warning pedestrian crossing, a 10-ton dump truck, 3 police cars, new in-car cameras for police cars, paving of Oak Terrace Development, Maple Avenue (from County Line Road to Route 611) and Virginia Lane.

The good news of no tax increase can be attributed to extraordinary efforts by our Township employees, who remain committed to providing excellent programs and services to our residents. They have been resourceful, creative, and tireless in their efforts to get the job done!

Our highway department will continue to maintain over 91.2 miles of township roadways by patching pot holes, salting, plowing, installing storm drains, tree trimming, and mowing road banks. Our Recreation Department will continue to provide a variety of programs as well as our Horsham Day. The Parks Department will continue to maintain over 826 acres of parks/open space and the powerline trail. Our accredited Police Department will continue to respond to a variety of calls for service. Our Code Enforcement Department will continue to provide guidance regarding building, zoning, and fire safety services and of course our administration offices will continue to be available to answer all of your questions.







Horsham History ~ Samuel Carpenter



Samuel Carpenter was born in Horsham, Sussex, England. He was baptized in the Church of St. Mary's Horsham on 20 November 1649.

Carpenter, along with many other Quakers, emigrated to the new colony of Pennsylvania in 1683 to escape the persecution which had become common across the West Indies.

In 1684 he purchased 5,000 acres of land from William Penn, 4200 of which lie in what is now Horsham Township, PA which was established as a municipal entity by a vote of the people in 1717 and named after Carpenter's birthplace.

Samuel Carpenter also served the new colony as Deputy Governor from 1694-1698. William Penn, as Proprietor, was the governor, but often left management of the colony to the deputy governor. He also served as Treasurer (1704-1710, 1711-1713), Member of the Assembly (1693-1694, 1696 and Member of the Assembly in Bucks County (1705). Carpenter was likely the wealthiest and most powerful person in the colony of Pennsylvania behind William Penn.

Samuel Carpenter died on 10 April 1714 and is buried at the Society of Friends (Quakers) Burial Ground at Fourth and Arch Streets in Philadelphia.

NEW GROUNDWATER CONTAMINATION CONCERNS AROUND FORMER NAS-JRB WILLOW GROVE

The U.S. Navy and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) are continuing to investigate groundwater in and around Horsham Township. They are checking both public water supply wells and private drinking water wells for levels of perfluorinated chemicals (PFCs) – compounds identified as 'emerging contaminants'. PFCs are man-made compounds and do not occur naturally in the environment. PFCs are used in a wide variety of industrial and commercial products including textiles, paper and packaging, cleaning products and in aqueous firefighting foam (AFFF). AFFF was commonly used at airfields (including NAS-JRB Willow Grove) to extinguish flammable liquid fires.

Test results received to date indicate that PFCs levels above the EPA's health advisory levels for these compounds are present in two wells operated by the Horsham Water and Sewer Authority (HWSA), some private residential wells and in wells on the former base. The HWSA has removed the affected wells from service and is working closely with the Navy and EPA on the appropriate corrective action. For those private wells with levels above the health advisory levels, the Navy is providing bottled water to the affected homeowners.

The EPA and the Navy are coordinating closely with the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection (PADEP), the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)/Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry (ATSDR) and the HWSA to ensure that public health is protected.

What you should know about

SMOKE ALARMS

Smoke Alarms Save Lives

The most important things you need to know are smoke alarms save lives and they should be in every home. Follow these important smoke alarm safety measures:

- **Make sure your smoke alarms are working.** This means testing smoke alarms monthly, replacing batteries once a year or when a low-battery alarm chirps and performing other maintenance as NFPA and your smoke alarm manufacturers recommend. And of course, a smoke alarm disabled because of nuisance alarms provides no protection at all.



- **It is important to have not just one smoke alarm but smoke alarms in every location required by NFPA standards.** (On each level of your home, outside each sleeping area and inside each bedroom.) Tens of millions of U.S. homes are estimated to have smoke alarms but not enough smoke alarms to meet the standards and protect their homes.

- **Interconnect your smoke alarms so that a fire detected by any smoke alarm will sound an alarm at every location where a smoke alarm is installed.** Interconnection can be done using hard-wiring or wireless broadcast technology. Interconnected smoke alarms provide early warning of fires that are still far away or are located on the other side of a door or wall that may block sound.

- **Develop and practice an escape plan so that everyone in the home knows what to do if the smoke alarm sounds.** That includes planning a second way out from every room in your home. Every household that develops and practices an escape plan with two ways out from every location improves its time to escape in every type of fire.

There Are Different Types of Smoke Alarm Technologies — Ionization and Photoelectric

The two most commonly recognized smoke detection technologies are ionization smoke detection and photoelectric smoke detection. Ionization smoke detection is generally more responsive to flaming fires and photoelectric smoke detection is generally more responsive to fires that begin with a long period of smoldering (called “smoldering fires”). For each type of smoke alarm, the advantage it provides may be critical to life safety in some fire situations.

Home fatal fires, day or night, include a large number of smoldering fires and a large number of flaming fires. You can not predict the type of fire you may have in your home or when it will occur. Any smoke alarm technology, to be acceptable, must perform acceptably for both types of fires in order to provide early warning of fire at all times of the day or night and whether you are asleep or awake.

The best evidence has always indicated that either

type of smoke alarm will provide sufficient time for escape for most people for most fires of either smoldering or flaming type. However, research is ongoing, and standards are living documents. If at any time, research points to a different conclusion, then that will lead to proposals for changes in the NFPA standard or the closely related Underwriters Laboratories standard for testing and approving smoke alarms. Both organizations currently have task groups looking at smoke alarm performance in the current home environment.

For Best Protection Use Both Types of Smoke Alarm Technologies

For best protection, it is recommended both (ionization and photoelectric) technologies be in homes. In addition to individual ionization and photoelectric alarms, combination alarms that include both technologies in a single device are available.

Nuisance Alarms Can Be Minimized

Ionization type smoke alarms are more susceptible to nuisance alarms due to cooking, the leading cause of nuisance alarms, but both types have some susceptibility to nuisance alarms from cooking fumes, and both have susceptibility to nuisance alarms from the steam from a hot shower.

In the past decade or so, a number of steps have been taken to reduce the likelihood of nuisance alarms, including hush features and refinements to installation rules that include guidance on safe distances from nuisance sources.

TV Demonstrations of Smoke Alarm Performance Can Be Misleading

Informal demonstrations, such as ones done for TV news shows, of smoke alarm performance can seriously mislead the viewer and do not provide a sound basis to assess performance. These demonstration tests are not performed in a controlled or scientific way that compares the time of smoke alarm operation to the time when occupants would be incapacitated. The selected fire scenarios may not be representative of real fatal home fires. Passing or failing a “test” of this sort may have nothing to do with performing well or badly in the wide range of real fires. A valid engineering analysis must select fires that are realistic and analyze them accordingly.

In an informal demonstration, the eye reacts to conditions that look dangerous, mostly visible smoke and visible flame. However, most people are killed by invisible gases, which do not necessarily spread at the same rate as smoke or flame. A valid engineering analysis must measure conditions caused by fires and assess them according to their real danger.


