

FRIENDS OF HORSHAM LIBRARY MAKE GENEROUS DONATION

The Horsham Library has upgraded to their movie and sound system with a generous donation from The Friends of the Horsham Library. The Friends is a Not-For-Profit Organization with a mission to enrich lives in our community by stimulating increased usage and enhancement of library resources and services. The Friends are vastly supported by individuals and local businesses. They hold multiple book sales every year, which raise money for library programs and donations.



Members of Horsham Township Council and the Library Board of Directors join The Friends of the Horsham Library to thank them for their generous donation.

The Friends purchased a complete 4 speaker sound system with a 16 channel sound board. They also purchased a ceiling mounted projector and blu-ray player as well as new window treatments for the meeting room to create a true "theater system". This generous donation made to the library amounted to \$12,000.00.

All the upgrades allow the library to show movies in full digital. The new sound system is also equipped with wireless hand held microphones and wireless lavalier microphones, which will be incredibly useful during large programs and author visits.

With the new sound and video projection equipment the library is able to run expanded film programs for all ages. The library plans to have a variety of family movies once a month, complete with fresh popcorn, featuring Disney favorites, animated movies and popular children's favorites. The library has also scheduled series of Young Adults Silver Screen Spectaculars and Senior Morning Movie Mania programs complete with coffee and donuts.

NAS-JRB WILLOW GROVE UPDATE ~ HLRA Update

The Horsham Land Redevelopment Authority (HLRA) continues to work towards acquiring the surplus property at the former NAS-JRB Willow Grove. In January 2015, the HLRA Board voted to begin negotiations with Catellus Development Corporation on an Exclusive Negotiation Agreement (ENA) as Master Developer for the base. The ENA will relate to Catellus providing assistance to the HLRA in negotiations with the Navy on the Economic Development Conveyance (EDC) application and may lead to resolving the details of a Master Development Agreement. The HLRA Board selected Catellus after an extensive review process which began in early 2014. The process involved proposal reviews, face-to-face interviews and site visits with a short list of qualified firms interested in redeveloping the 862 acres at the former base. Catellus past projects include developing closed military bases and other aviation facilities into mixed use developments very similar to the HLRA's Plan.

In March 2015, the Navy released the Final Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the Disposal and Reuse of the Naval Air Station Joint Reserve Base Willow Grove PA. The Final EIS Report describes the environmental impacts of four alternatives for the redevelopment of NAS-JRB Willow Grove, including the HLRA's Redevelopment Plan. The EIS is required by the National Environmental Policy Act, which requires that environmental impacts be identified on all major federal government projects. Updates Around Horsham



Easton Road (Rt. 611) Traffic Signal Timing Initiative

The traffic signal retiming took effect on April 9th. It included traffic signals from Cheltenham Township to Horsham Township along the 611 corridor. Implementation of the improved traffic signal timings are anticipated to improve overall traffic flow and reduce traffic congestion. Initial reports indicate an improvement with traffic flow on Easton Road. We will continue to monitor the corridor as well as any impact to side street traffic.

Rt. 611 Transportation Study

This study is expected to be completed by early summer. The roadway corridors included in the study are Rt. 611, Horsham Rd (Rt. 463), County Line Rd., Limekiln Pike (Rt. 152), Welsh Rd. (Rt. 63), Norristown Rd., and Blair Mill Road. The study evaluates existing and anticipated future conditions. The study's purpose is to provide a better understanding of potential transportation improvements to combat recurring weekday traffic congestion and to provide a more complete transportation network.

Turnpike Corridor Reinvestment Project

The project report is complete and includes concept plans to improve the Willow Grove interchange and a new interchange for Welsh Road. The project goal is to reinvigorate business parks along the Turnpike and to protect and sustain our local economy and jobs. Horsham Township will continue working with the PA Turnpike Commission, Montgomery County, and our municipal partners.



Brand Strategy

Township Council will be selecting a consultant this summer to develop a strong brand that provides a unifying message that serves to increase commercial activity, redevelopment, and a sense of community. The desired outcome of this project is to create a compelling brand for Horsham, one that defines and distinguishes our community.



Horsham Business Park Master Plan

This project will create a master plan for the Horsham Business Center and PA Business Campus to guide future land use and infrastructure improvements that will keep the parks competitive for the future. The plan will identify market opportunities, appropriate land uses, locations for new land uses, recommended design guidelines, recommended zoning changes, possible business park amenities, and potential road and other infrastructure improvements. The plan is expected to be completed by the end of the year.

Kohler Park Pond wall

The construction of a stone wall around the pond in Kohler Park will be completed by Memorial Day. This project started last year with 500 feet of wall being installed. The wall will prolong the life of the pond by stopping the erosion of the banks. It will also add to the aesthetics of the park as well as provide better recreational access for those who fish at the pond.

Witmer Rd. Pedestrian Crossing and Connecting Trail

Township Council has authorized staff and the Township Engineer to design and install a pedestrian crossing and trail on Witmer Road at Business Center Drive. This trail will connect the Horshamtowne development and the Horsham Business Center to the popular Power Line Trail as well as Lukens Park – Everybody's Playground. The trail is scheduled to be completed by the end of the year.



Curbs & Sidewalks

It is a good idea to inspect the condition of your concrete curbs, sidewalks and driveway aprons annually. These concrete areas need to be maintained throughout their life and if they get to a point of disrepair they may need to be fixed or replaced. You should be inspecting for cracks, difference in height from one block to the next, spalling or falling apart. For a complete list and explanations of what to look for please visit www.horsham.org, select "Departments", select "Highway" and under "Highway" select "Curbs and Sidewalks". Before you begin any work or have a contractor begin any work you will need to get a permit from the Code Enforcement Department, they will also have a packet explaining the standards to which the repairs must be constructed to. Before cement is poured on your project the Highway Department needs to come out and inspect the work area to make sure that the work is done to code. This step protects you the homeowner, so you want to make sure that it is done. If this step is not completed at the proper time the permit will not be closed.

When Horsham Township is going to perform a paving project on your road the township will come around and mark your curbs and sidewalks letting you know that these areas need to be repaired. We will notify you 12 to 16 months before the work needs to be completed. You will have two options to get your curbs and sidewalks repaired: hire a contractor to make the necessary repairs or call the Highway Department and use the Township contractor that has been awarded the bid – you will then be billed for the work by that contractor. You will need to make sure that you or your contractor get a permit, prep the work to code, and have your inspection before concrete is poured, for your permit to be closed.

PROPERTY MAINTENANCE IS AN INVESTMENT THAT PAYS OFF

To the property owner, summer means more than barbeques and vacations. It is the time to examine the exterior of your property looking for any damage caused by spring weather and making sure weeds are under control.

As a result of spring rains, grass and weed populations grow quickly. Horsham Township, like most area municipalities, restricts weed and plant growth to less than 6 inches high. Cultivated flowers and garden areas are not included in this height restriction, but all noxious weeds are prohibited. To determine which plants fall into the noxious category contact the Horsham Township Code Enforcement at (215) 643-3131.



Take a walk around your property. Pay particular attention to sheds, fences, trellises, and rose arbors that can take a beating from high winds. While walking around the exterior of your home, don't forget to look up.

Inspect siding, roofs, gutters, and down spouts for damage. Check for peeling paint. If wooden surfaces are left unprotected, water damage can result in surprisingly high repair bills. Wire brush, sand, prime or repaint surfaces as needed. Repair or replace loose and damaged aluminum that covers the fascia-a flat board, band or face, often used in combination with moldings and located at the outer face of the cornice. These building components may seem like small matters; however, if left unattended, they can provide a path for the elements to begin the structural deterioration of your property.

If you are planning to install a new deck, swimming pool or shed, Horsham Township requires building permits and inspections. The Horsham Township Code Enforcement is more than glad to explain regulations for decks, pools and other outside property maintenance issues. We encourage residents to call us with questions at (215) 643-3131.

Simple measures are key to protecting property and maintaining property values that will ensure a strong return on the time, money and hard work property owners invest in their property. In addition, it will ensure the quality of life remaining high in our residential neighborhoods.

A Message From The Fire Marshal

Outdoor Grilling



Be sure to use safe cooking practices as the peak grilling season nears. Charcoal and propane gas grills must only be used outdoors. If used in an enclosed space, nearby combustibles could be ignited, and toxic gases such as carbon monoxide will be emitted. Always position grills away from the main house or garage, deck railings, overhanging vegetation, play areas, and traffic paths to prevent risk of fire and injury. Please note that in multiple family dwellings it is illegal to utilize open flame cooking devices on balconies or within 10 feet of combustibles construction.



FIREWORKS POSE SAFETY RISK

The use of fireworks in Horsham Township is illegal and poses a safety risk to anyone who uses them. According to the National Fire Protection Agency, on July 4th of each year thousands of people are injured while using consumer fireworks. Permanent scarring, loss of vision, dismemberment, and even death can occur from amateur use of fireworks. The safest way to enjoy fireworks is to watch a public display conducted by trained professionals.

MOSQUITO PREVENTION TIPS

Mosquitoes can lay up to 250 eggs at a time in still water and will hatch in 7 to 10 days. However, if you and your neighbors take steps to eliminate standing water from around your home, the mosquito population will be reduced dramatically. Consider the following tips to prevent mosquitoes from ruining your outdoor activities.



- Make sure your gutters and downspouts are clean and running properly, and adjust them as necessary to provide proper drainage.
- Survey your property to see if anything stored outdoors might collect and hold water.
- Remove standing water in ponds, ditches, clogged rain gutters, flower pots, plant saucers, and puddles.
- Clean and rinse birdbaths at least weekly.

HORSHAM HISTORY



In 1967 Horsham Township was officially 250 years old. To celebrate this event public spirited citizens came together to organize activities that would emphasize the unique heritage of the township, and the richness of the interests of its residents. The events of May 12-June 3, 1967, sponsored by the Chamber of Commerce showed the great deal of preparation that had preceded the festivities. All the community organizations sponsored programs, the central theme of each, was the township's anniversary. The younger members of the township participated in events devised by each of the schools, such as Old-Fashioned Dress-Up Day, and an art show, featuring paintings of famous landmarks in the community. A Youth Day and Ox Roast were held at the Hatboro-Horsham High School. There was something to interest everyone. Pet lovers had a pet show, and the firemen had a parade. To commemorate the 250th Jubilee, an emblem was designed, consisting of a golden horseshoe which encloses a plow, and a small sketch of Keith House. The celebration was climaxed by a family picnic and the dedication of a new municipal park. In order to continue the spirit of the Jubilee, a special day is now set aside each year to commemorate the heritage and history of Horsham Township. This celebration is now known as Horsham Day which is held the 1st Saturday in June each year.

“THERE IS NO PLACE LIKE ... WORK?”



Recently, the Philadelphia Inquirer published an article “There Is No Place like...Work?” This article notes that one does not have to be in the real estate business to recognize that Horsham has become a very attractive location for people to live and work. 2015 Roadway Maintenance Program

Horsham Township will be milling and resurfacing the following streets in 2015:

- Maple Avenue – County Line Rd to Easton Rd (Rt. 611)
- Oak Terrace Drive
- Lawrence Lane
- Beverly Road
- Spur Lane
- Virginia Lane
- Chestnut Lane – Limekiln Pike (Rt. 152) to Fairway Rd.
- Lower State Road – Limekiln Pike (Rt. 152) to County Line Rd.



In addition, the PA Department of Transportation will be milling and resurfacing Welsh Road (Rt. 63) and Easton Road (Rt. 611) within Horsham Township.

Horsham Township strives to resurface its roadways every 25 years. Age, however, is not the only factor that determines when a street is resurfaced. It is actually one of the final factors after evaluating a road’s structural integrity, use classification, and available budget for road resurfacing activities. Streets that are in an advanced state of deterioration typically receive a higher priority over those that are in satisfactory condition. Similarly, roadways that are more frequently traveled are considered a priority over those that receive less traffic. The age of the road and the township’s resurfacing budget are the final factors in determining whether a street is actually paved in any given year. Unfortunately, the cost of street resurfacing activities has increased substantially over the years. For example, the cost of asphalt was \$31.50 per ton in 2005, but in 2015 the Township will pay \$55.95 per ton, or 78% more than was paid 10 years ago. Despite these cost increases, the township is typically able to perform roadway maintenance activities to 3 miles of streets each year.



“Stop” Bars Explained

The large white lines painted horizontally across the road are called “stop” bars. They advise motorists where to stop as they approach an intersection controlled by a traffic signal or “stop” sign. The road



marking essentially serves two functions: 1) It designates the proper location for vehicles to stop at an intersection so that vehicles turning from a perpendicular direction have enough room to make the turn (especially trucks and buses); and 2) It aligns vehicles with optical or induction control sensors that operate traffic signals. If a vehicle stops too far back or forward of the stop bar at an intersection controlled by a traffic signal, the sensors will not recognize that a vehicle is waiting and the signal will not change from red to green. The sensors can also detect how many vehicles are waiting at an intersection so that the traffic signal can regulate traffic flow more efficiently.

Protect Our Community from Illegal Dumping and Littering



Make no mistake: Littering and illegal dumping are against the law. There are, however, subtle differences between the two. Litter is primarily small items that have been scattered,

including paper, food and beverage containers, convenience products, newspapers, and cardboard. Littering can be intentional or accidental. For instance, some trash found along the road — items blown from yards and vehicles or debris left over from accidents — is the result of an unintentional act. Illegal dumping, on the other hand, is always intentional and done for many reasons: convenience, ignorance, habit, profit, or to hide other illegal activities. Illegal dumping often involves large items or large quantities of small items, such as appliances, tires, bags of household trash, furniture, and construction and demolition debris. Despite their differences, litter and illegally dumped items are costly and time-consuming to clean up. Both also pose significant threats to the environment and to the health and safety of humans, animals, and the communities they live in. Any improper disposal of trash— littering or illegal dumping— is against the law, and violators can be prosecuted. Many residents, though, are uncertain about what to do when they observe this illegal activity. Most important, if you observe someone littering or dumping: call 911 and they will dispatch the local police to take control of the crime.

Horsham Township Addresses Stormwater Issues

Have you ever wondered where the oil goes that makes driving so dangerous after the first rainfall? Or what happens to the detergent that runs down the driveway when you wash your car? The used oil, as well as detergents, dirty water and soaps from washing your car, are carried through city drains into the nearest lake, stream, bay or ocean.

Anything dumped or dropped on the ground or in the gutter can end up in the nearest body of water. Stormwater pollution results from materials and chemicals washed into the storm drains from streets, gutters, neighborhoods, industrial sites, parking lots and construction sites. This type of pollution is significant because, unlike the water that goes down a sink or toilet in your home, stormwater is untreated and flows directly to a lake, river, or the ocean.

Stormwater systems were originally intended to route rainwater quickly off the streets during a heavy storm. Unfortunately, these systems can carry pollutants such as pesticides, bacteria and chemicals through city streets and straight to our waters. Stormwater pollution can include chemicals, fast food wrappers, cigarette butts, Styrofoam cups, sewage overflow, cooking oil, bacteria from pet waste, used motor oil, fertilizers, paint and construction debris.

Basic steps people can do each day to prevent storm water pollution:

- Don't dump waste into storm drains.
- Keep yard clippings out of the street.
- Dispose of household chemicals properly by following the directions on the package.
- Clean up oil spills and fix leaking automobiles.
- Use drip pans to catch engine oil and other pollutants while repairing cars.
- Recycle used motor oil.
- Sweep driveways clean instead of hosing them down.
- Wash your car at a commercial car wash, or at least wash your car on an unpaved surface so the excess water can be absorbed by the ground.



Vacation Checklist

Vacations provide burglars with plenty of time to enter an unoccupied home and remove large items or search leisurely for hidden valuables. If you are planning a vacation, please take precautions to protect your home while you are away. It is important to create an illusion of everyday activity. Following this checklist will make it appear that someone is home, which is your first defense against burglary.

- Ask police to check your home and patrol your neighborhood more closely while you are away. If you contact the Police Department at 215-643-8284 and request a vacation check while you are away, township patrol officers will monitor your home each shift for unusual activity.
- Stop mail and newspaper deliveries or have a trusted neighbor collect them while you are away so that they do not accumulate. Also ask your neighbor to remove any advertising flyers that are deposited in your mailbox or around your door, driveway or lawn.
- Secure all doors, windows, pet entrances and garage doors.
- Transfer valuables to a safety deposit box or have a family member store them until you return.
- Place timers on indoor lamps and appliances to illuminate your home at night, and set timers to turn on radios and televisions randomly during the day.
- Keep some shades and blinds up and curtains open to maintain a normal appearance.

Medication Collection Box Allows Citizens to Anonymously Drop Off Unused and Out-of-Date Medications

The Horsham Police Department has a drop box to collect unused and out-of-date medications and prescriptions for proper disposal. The collection box is accessible 24 hours a day and allows our residents to drop off their unwanted medications.

Dangers of Improper Prescription Disposal:

- Almost all prescription drugs involved in overdoses are originally prescribed by physicians.
- Prescription drug abuse has quadrupled in the past ten years; it now results in more deaths than all illicit street drugs combined.
- Prescription drug abuse is growing among adolescents in Pennsylvania: 13 percent of high school-aged children have abused opioid pain relievers, 6 percent tranquilizers, and 12 percent amphetamines (Adderall and Ritalin).
- Improper disposal of prescription drugs could create environmental hazards impacting groundwater and rivers and harming wildlife.




