

## HORSHAM TOWNSHIP SCORES EXCEPTIONAL ON SAFEST PLACES TO LIVE IN PENNSYLVANIA!

Township Manager, William Walker, is proud to announce that Horsham Township has been selected as one of the safest cities in Pennsylvania for 2016. A recent study using crime data from the FBI's Uniform Crime Report ranked Horsham Township in the top 40 out of 2,562 municipalities in Pennsylvania. They scored each city based on violent and property crime data to come up with a composite score. The study reported that Horsham Township's community policing philosophy is behind their low crime rate. Horsham Township offers a variety of programs that support communication between the Police Department and the community. A few examples are the ChAT's program and the Citizen Police Academy. The ChAT's program is an organized effort to get the citizens of Horsham more involved with their community. The Citizen's Police Academy is a 10 week course that educates residents on a variety of day to day policing duties.



President Deborah Tustin stated "On behalf of Horsham Council we are pleased to be ranked one of the safest cities in Pennsylvania. We believe this is really from the efforts of our Police Department and Community to ensure Horsham is not only a great place to live but a safe place to live." ### PFC Update

Horsham Township officials in conjunction with the Horsham Water and Sewer Authority (HWSA), continue to make the health and safety of their residents and those who work in the township a top priority. In April 2016, the HWSA, with the full support of the Horsham Township Council, voluntarily lowered the threshold for the acceptable levels of perfluorinated compounds (PFOA) in their water system. Since becoming aware of the potential health effects of PFCs in drinking water in July 2014, HWSA has taken all the actions necessary to insure their water meets all current drinking water standards and is safe to drink.

Horsham Township officials are also closely monitoring the efforts of the U.S. Navy and the PA Air National Guard to respond to the impacts of the military's past operations which has resulted in PFC groundwater contamination in neighborhoods adjacent to the base. Township officials are working with the military services to insure that residential properties with private wells are tested for PFC contamination and, if warranted, provided with bottled water on a temporary basis until a permanent connection to the HWSA public water system is made.

### Horsham Township Public Works Department Awarded



Horsham Township was recently awarded a Risk Management Innovation Award. The Public Works Department submitted the application for the award. The award was given to the Township for its new re-purposed office area in the Public Works garage. A once cluttered area is now a "multi-functional area" that can be quickly reconfigured for varying work tasks including: monitoring weather conditions, field conditions, reviewing plans, safety training and educational meetings. When not in use for meetings the room can be set up as sleeping quarters for the Public Works personnel during extended storm operations. This multi-functional area will help to improve the safety of our Public Works Department during daily business and storm operations.

### Feasibility Study Completed for Township Building

Now that a feasibility study has been completed, Horsham Township Council is eyeing the construction of a new municipal building in the near future. The current building was originally built in 1959 with two additions in 1971 and 1989. The study showed the costs for a new building would be the same when compared to renovating the current facility. On April 25, 2016, Council authorized a request for proposals for architectural services and plan to hire a firm in late June.

In 2015, Township Manager William Walker, updated Council on the current conditions of the building and recommended a study to explore options to meet the long-term facility needs.

Councilman William Whiteside said, "In 1959, the Township had 8,933 residents and very few employees. These days, Horsham has more than 26,147 residents, 86 employees, 850 acres of parkland and open space and 91 miles of roadways. In addition, the redevelopment of 862 acres formerly the Willow Grove Naval Air Station will be starting soon. We need an efficient, modern municipal building for the future."

The feasibility study showed the building is well maintained but is deficient in some areas such as accessibility, security, technology, layout and energy efficiency.

Councilman Tom Johnson said "the design process will look at everything from enhancing energy efficiency to providing greater safety to a state-of-the-art public meeting room. He is confident that the design will consider the future needs of the Horsham community."

"We have been planning to address the municipal building. We have completed the firehouses, library, community center, public works facility and police station. This is the last building/facility that needs to be addressed for the future," said Mr. Walker.



## 20TH CITIZEN'S POLICE ACADEMY



The Citizen's Police Academy shows those who attend just what our officers do in the course of their day. Classes include accident investigation, crimes code, use of force, SWAT, a K-9 presentation and then participants get to take part in a "crime scene" investigation. This course can be helpful to those of all ages. Many participants and graduates complete this program for different reasons such as building a resume for their next steps in the criminal justice field while others enjoy becoming more involved in their community. 
## Look For Branding Strategy Survey!

## CURBS & SIDEWALKS

It is a good idea to inspect the condition of your concrete curbs, sidewalks, driveway aprons and pipes annually. These concrete areas need to be maintained throughout their life and if they get to a point of disrepair they may need to be fixed or replaced. You should be inspecting for cracks, difference in height from one block to the next, spalling or falling apart. Before you or your contractor begin any work you will need to get a permit from the Code Enforcement Department, Code will also provide you a packet explaining the standards to which the repairs must be constructed. You can also find the packet, Detailed Concrete



Specifications, on the Horsham Township website, [www.horsham.org](http://www.horsham.org). Before cement is poured on your project the Public Works Department needs to be contacted to schedule an inspection, to make sure that the work is done to code. This step protects you the homeowner, it is very important that you have this completed, if this step is not completed at the proper time the permit will not be closed.

## HORSHAM HISTORY

In 1926, when many people were afraid of airplanes and most considered flying a daredevil sport, aviation pioneer Harold Pitcairn bought a large section of farmland on the west side of Doylestown Pike, now Route 611. No sooner were the arrangements of sale signed and the checks handed over when Pitcairn began the work that turned the farmland into a flying field. A hangar was soon built near the highway and the grass was mowed for a landing strip. Pitcairn developed, tested, built and flew many different aircraft, most notable being the Mailwing and the Autogyro.

In 1927, when Pitcairn won the Postal Service contract to carry the overnight mail between New York and Atlanta, he designed the Mailwing. Faster, safer and more efficient than any other aircraft on the market, the Mailwing was immediately bought as standard equipment by many other airlines. Pilots loved the aircraft because of its reliability and ease of handling. When crashes did occur, pilots were often able to walk away with minor injuries due to the Mailwing's rugged construction. In December of 1928, Pitcairn first brought the Autogyro to America. This aviation phenomenon, with its uncanny ability to make steep takeoffs without danger of stalling and to land nearly vertically with no-roll landings, had been developed by the

Spanish aeronautical engineer, Juan de la Cierva. Recognizing the potential of this aircraft, Pitcairn bought the American rights to Cierva's patents and soon Autogyros, as well as Mailwings were being turned out of the Pitcairn aircraft factory. Although the Autogyro did not become the commercial success that many hoped it would, the Pitcairn patents were purchased by Sikorski and utilized in developing the helicopter. Pitcairn Aviation, from its early mail route start, went on to later become Eastern Airlines.

## FROM THE DESK OF THE FIRE MARSHAL



The new craze Self-Balancing Scooters, or otherwise known as “Hoverboards” were one of the most popular gifts this past holiday season. However, many have been found to be defective and

have caught fire. The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, an independent federal regulatory agency responsible for protecting consumers from unreasonable risks of injury and death from consumer products, are urging all manufacturers, importers and retailers of these self-balancing scooters to make certain that they comply with currently applicable voluntary safety standards, including all referenced standards and requirements contained in UL 2272 – Outline of Investigation for Electrical Systems for Self-Balancing Scooters. Additionally, all lithium ion battery products must comply with test requirements under UN/DOT 38.3—Transport of Dangerous Goods for Lithium Metal and Lithium Ion Batteries.

The Consumer Product Safety Commission Office of Compliance and Field Operations staff consider self-balancing scooters which do not meet these voluntary safety standards referenced above to be defective.

From December 1, 2015 through February 17, 2016, the CPSC received reports from consumers in 24 states, of 52 self-balancing scooter fires resulting in over \$2 million in property damage, including the destruction of two homes and an automobile. It is their belief that many of the reported incidents, and the related unreasonable risk of injuries and deaths associated with fires in these products would be prevented if all such products were manufactured in compliance with the referenced voluntary standards.

## Horsham Township Police Department K-9 Unit UPDATE



There have been many changes at the Horsham Police Department including TWO newest members that are unique to the rest of the Police Department. Horsham Township Council is proud to announce the arrival of: Banner (a German Shepard) and Gallent (a Dutch Shepard) who will be joining the Horsham Police Department in July. In 2015, Council approved expanding the Horsham Police Department by adding a K-9 Unit. There are multiple benefits the K-9's will offer the Police Department. The K-9 working dogs are more agile and have a significantly better sense of smell than humans. This makes them more efficient at clearing buildings, tracking suspects or missing persons, seeking out drugs or explosives, and even locate accelerants in arson investigations. The Police Department has officially named Sergeant Richard Carey the K-9 program supervisor along with Officer Kate Ryan and Officer Andrew D'Arcy as Horsham's First K-9 handlers. Banner and Gallent will come to the Police Department fully trained by a facility in North Carolina that specializes in the training of working K-9 dogs.

The K-9 Unit for the Horsham Township Police Department has been established thanks to the generous donations from businesses and residents of Horsham Township. ## ZIKA VIRUS

Zika virus is a mosquito-borne single-stranded RNA virus related to dengue virus (a mosquito-borne viral disease occurring in tropical and subtropical areas). In the Americas, Zika virus is primarily transmitted by *Aedes aegypti* (mosquito), but *Aedes albopictus* mosquitoes can also transmit the virus. *Aedes* mosquitoes are aggressive daytime biters and feed both indoors and outdoors. There is no vaccine to prevent Zika virus infection. Travelers can protect themselves by taking steps to prevent mosquito bites. Use insect repellent; wear long-sleeved shirts and long pants; and stay in places with air conditioning or with window and door screens. Pregnant women can and should choose an EPA-registered insect repellent and use it according to the product label. Zika virus can be transmitted from a pregnant mother to her fetus during pregnancy or around the time of birth. About 1 in 5 people infected with Zika virus become symptomatic. Characteristic clinical findings are acute onset of fever with maculopapular rash, arthralgia, or conjunctivitis.

Other commonly reported symptoms include myalgia and headache. Clinical illness is usually mild with symptoms lasting for several days to a week. Zika virus infections have been confirmed in several infants with microcephaly (a condition in which a baby's head is significantly smaller than expected); it is not known how many of the microcephaly cases are associated with Zika virus infection. Studies are under way to investigate the association of Zika virus infection and microcephaly, including the role of other contributing factors (e.g., prior or concurrent infection with other organisms, nutrition, and environment).

## VACATION CHECKLIST

Vacations provide burglars with plenty of time to enter an unoccupied home and remove large items or search leisurely for hidden valuables. If you are planning a vacation, please take precautions to protect your home while you are away. It is important to create an illusion of everyday activity. Following this checklist will make it appear that someone is home, which is your first defense against burglary.

- If you contact the Police Department at 215-643-8284 and request a vacation check while you are away, township patrol officers will monitor your home for unusual activity.
- Stop mail and newspaper deliveries or have a trusted neighbor collect them while you are away so that they do not accumulate.
- Secure all doors, windows, pet entrances and garage doors.
- Transfer valuables to a safety deposit box or have a family member store them until you return.
- Place timers on indoor lamps and appliances to illuminate your home at night, and set timers to turn on radios and televisions randomly during the day.
- Keep some shades and blinds up and curtains open to maintain a normal appearance.

### Penn State Students Create Robot for Public Works Department



Horsham Township Public Works Department partnered with the Penn State Abington and Brandywine Engineering faculty and students to solve the problem of visual underground storm water pipe inspections. Horsham Township provided the engineering class

several pieces of pipe made of different materials that are similar to Horsham's storm water infrastructure. The students and faculty tackled the challenge of navigating a camera while inside of a pipe to observe possible structural damage. The students developed a 6 wheel all terrain robot with a video/still camera and high intensity LED light. The robot has large tires so that it can go over rough terrain that it may encounter in the stormwater pipes, sending pictures and videos back to the controller through an Ethernet cable. The Public Works Department invited the students and professor out to Horsham to complete several field trials. This robot/camera will help our Public Works Department with pipe inspections and diagnosing problems within a pipe. This collaborative effort saved the township approximately \$50,000 over the purchase of a commercial storm water pipe camera. Horsham Township Council recognized the PSU students and staff along with the Public Works Department at their April 12, 2016 Council meeting.

### NAS-JRB WILLOW GROVE UPDATE



The HLRA is continuing to monitor the Navy's and the Pennsylvania Air National Guard (ANG) efforts to investigate the PFC groundwater contamination discovery in the area of the former NAS-JRB Willow Grove. Perfluorinated compounds are man-made chemicals used in a variety of products such as fabric,

carpets, non-stick cookware, floor wax and firefighting foam. The Navy actively used firefighting foam at NAS-JRB Willow Grove for training purposes. The Navy and PA ANG have begun comprehensive field investigations including drilling new monitoring wells and collection of soil and sediment samples to determine the nature and extent of the contamination. The HLRA and Horsham Township's top priority continues to be the health and safety of our residents and business community. The HLRA, Horsham Township and the Navy are anxiously awaiting EPA's establishment of a final drinking water standard for the PFC compounds. Negotiations between the HLRA and the Navy on the value of the property and the timing of the transfer may be impacted by the EPA's decision relating to PFCs.

## 2016 ROADWAY MAINTENANCE PROGRAM

Horsham Township strives to resurface its roadways every 30 years. Age, however, is not the only factor that determines when a street is resurfaced. It is actually one of the final factors after evaluating a road's structural integrity, use classification, and available budget for road resurfacing activities. Streets that are in an advanced state of deterioration typically receive a higher priority over those that are in satisfactory condition. Similarly, roadways that are more frequently traveled are considered a priority over those that receive less traffic. The age of the road and the township's resurfacing budget are the final factors in determining whether a street is actually paved in any given year.

All buildings shall have approved address numbers placed in a position to be plainly legible and visible from the street or road

fronting the property. These numbers shall contrast with their background. Address numbers shall be Arabic numerals or alphabet letters. Numbers shall be a minimum of 4 inches high with a minimum stroke width of 0.5 inch.

## SAWMILL PARK AND PLAYGROUND RENOVATIONS

Horsham Township is fortunate to have the largest municipal owned park system in Montgomery County, Pennsylvania. The Horsham park system contains more than 820+ acres in 47 sites ranging from community parks to neighborhood parks to open space and 14 miles of trails to enjoy. Sawmill Playground is one of the many sites in Horsham Township that includes open space with a playground apparatus for children to enjoy. Residents will notice renovations happening throughout this year to include a new playground structure and changes to the landscaping.



## Stormwater

Stormwater flows over driveways, lawns, and sidewalks, it picks up debris, chemicals, dirt, and other pollutants. Stormwater then flows into a storm sewer system or directly to a lake, stream, river, wetland, or coastal water. Anything that enters our storm sewer system is discharged untreated into the waterbodies we use for swimming, fishing, and providing drinking water. It does not go to the water treatment facility. Polluted runoff is the nation's greatest threat to clean water. By practicing healthy household habits, homeowners can keep common pollutants like pesticides, pet waste, grass clippings, and automotive fluids off the ground and out of stormwater. Adopt these healthy household habits and help protect lakes, streams, rivers, wetlands, and coastal waters. Remember to share the habits with your neighbors!

### 10 Ways to Prevent Stormwater Runoff Pollution:

- Conserve water by stopping faucet drips
- Never dump anything down storm drains
- Pick up after your pet
- Sweep up driveways and sidewalks
- Use fertilizers and pesticides sparingly
- Plant gardens in bare spots
- Direct rooftop runoff to grass or gardens
- Check cars for leaks
- Wash cars at the car wash
- Compost your yard and organic wastes

## BUILDING PERMIT REMINDER

*Planning on renovating this summer? Want to build a deck or shed? Then you may require a Building Permit from Horsham Township. Building Permits are required for, but not limited to, the following:*



- New building or addition
- Decks, porches, and sunrooms
- Replacement windows or doors (where opening changes are made)
- Pre-fabricated swimming pools & hot tubs 24" and greater in depth
- New or Re-roofing and/or siding
- Patios (concrete, paver block, etc.)
- Finishing basements
- Installation of fences, utility sheds, and pole barns
- Lawn sprinkler systems
- Driveway paving / widening (including gravel)
- Any work along a street including curb & sidewalk repairs

Building Permit Process Guides can be found at the Horsham Township Building 1025 Horsham Road or visit the Horsham Township website [www.horsham.org](http://www.horsham.org) (under Departments, Code Enforcement, then Permit requirements). Failure to obtain a Building Permit before starting construction may result in delays or a fine. If you are unsure whether you need a Building Permit, please contact the Horsham Township Code Enforcement office at (215) 643-3131 and we will be happy to assist you. Call us before you build!

## MAINTAINING A SAFE ENVIRONMENT AROUND YOUR HOME SWIMMING POOL



Millions of us enjoy warm weather every year by swimming in our backyard pools and relaxing in hot tubs. Tragically though, over 200 young children drown in backyard swimming pools each year. The American Red Cross suggests owners make pool safety their top priority by following these guidelines:



- Secure your pool with appropriate barriers. Completely surround your pool with a 4-foot high fence or barrier with a self-closing, self-latching gate. Place a safety cover on the pool or hot tub when not in use and remove any ladders or steps used for access. Consider installing a pool alarm that goes off if anyone enters the pool.
- Keep children under active supervision at all times. Stay in arm's reach of young kids. Designate a responsible person to watch the water when people are in the pool—never allow anyone to swim alone. Have young or inexperienced swimmers wear a U.S. Coast Guard approved life jacket.
- Ensure everyone in the home knows how to swim well by enrolling them in age-appropriate water orientation and learn-to-swim courses from the Red Cross.
- Keep your pool or hot tub water clean and clear. Maintain proper chemical levels, circulation and filtration. Regularly test and adjust the chemical levels to minimize the risk of earaches, rashes or more serious diseases.
- Establish and enforce rules and safe behaviors, such as "no diving," "stay away from drain covers," "swim with a buddy" and "walk please."
- Ensure everyone in the home knows how to respond to aquatic emergencies by having appropriate safety equipment and taking water safety, first aid and CPR courses from the Red Cross.



**Monday, June 13 is the racing start for the library's 2016 Summer Reading Program.**


